I will form a business roundtable of Caribbean-American small businesses and

workers to advise the county on initiatives to better support Caribbean-American entrepreneurs and employees.

- What support would you provide for Caribbean-American students and parents, including language assistance and help navigating the school system?

I will advocate for Caribbean-American students and parents to ensure they receive support navigating our county public schools.

- How would you advance partnerships with Caribbean-American community organizations to promote mental health, chronic disease prevention, or other wellness initiatives?
