How would your office address barriers Caribbean immigrants face when accessing public services such as healthcare, safe, affordable housing, education or social programs that disproportionately affect them? - *My office works to ensure that we provide a safe environment that allows victims and their families to come forward to report a crime and to work with us as we move through the criminal justice process.*

How do you ensure culturally responsive services for Caribbean-American residents across agencies (e.g., health, education, law enforcement, etc.)? - *I think it is important to meet with community members regularly, coming to locations within the community to hold these meetings, to ensure that we understand the concerns and the particular issues and challenges you face and work together to address them.*
4. What initiatives will you lead and/or support that benefit Caribbean-American small business owners and workers, particularly in industries where they are heavily represented? - *While the Office of the State's Attorney*

How would you advance partnerships with Caribbean-American community organizations to promote mental health, chronic disease prevention, or other wellness initiatives? - **The Office of the State's Attorney has no role in these issues, but I would commit to regular meetings with the community to listen to concerns and work collaboratively to address issues that are within the purview of this office.**
7. How will you build trust and conduct robust oversight on local, law enforcement to protect the rights, security, and safety of Caribbean-American residents? - **I think it is important to meet with the community regularly to hear from them and to let them know what we are doing. These meetings should take place in the community and at the courthouse so we can all see the environments that we live/work in daily, have open and honest dialog and ensure that meaningful follow up is agreed upon so we can hold each other accountable to do it.**
